Aiming Towards Plastic Free Communities:


St Day and Carharrack have started the process to become a plastic free community with the aim to significantly reduce single-use plastic consumption.

As you know, we've been planting trees, sowing sunflower and wildflower seeds, clearing and improving footpaths and litter collecting too. Also, working with local landowners, members of Forest for Cornwall, Cornwall Council and Coastline on several projects and there's more to come. We have started to help to increase wildlife in both parishes through the provision of habitats, increased food source and by raising awareness eg Hedgehog Houses, Slow Down Hedgehog Signs, Weed Bee Friendly. local landowners are working in partnership with the Forestry Commission to plant thousands of trees across their land to improve the environment for wildlife.

By working in partnership 2021 saw many achievements, we have been able to implement many aspects of policy 4. What does 2022 look like...More Trees, More Seeds...Planning a Cornish Orchard, wouldn't this be 'St Day and Carharrack CAG Community Orchard'. great...

The Pound Carharrack We had an excellent turnout of volunteers at the Pound Field in September raking up the grass cuttings to encourage wild flower growth in the spring. The field is now well on its way to becoming a species rich meadow. The hard work was rewarded with vegan cake for all.





Sadly, at the beginning of January, the diseased Ash tree by the Shute in Carharrack had to be removed. It was replaced the very next day by a Lime tree, the Landmark tree provided by the 'Forest for Cornwall' scheme. It sits proudly in the middle of the Cove surrounded by four Mountain Ash trees planted three years ago.



The Great Big Green Week The Great Big Green Week kicked off on the 18th of September 2021 with the launch of our peatfree compost refill station at the Mills Hall car park. Brainchild of David Gould, the concept was born from a desire to encourage local people to ditch peat-based gardening products and to reduce the reliance on single-use plastic. The compost, which is produced by the Green Waste Company in Lelant,

There have been four refill stations to date and the next will be held on Saturday the 26th of February 2022. The last on the 15th of January was sold out within ninety minutes! Encouragingly, many people are returning to the refill station after their first visit and at least two other villages have been in touch to request information with a view to setting up something similar in their area. An information pack has been produced for anyone who wants to learn more about the issues surrounding the use of peat and it also includes tips on avoiding purchasing hidden peat in other gardening products https://sdccag.com/peat/.

In 2021 St Day and Carharrack Primary School embarked on a journey to become Change-Makers with help an encouragement from St Day and Carharrack Climate Action Group. We began by improving our school grounds, we built a polytunnel and vegetable garden so that we can learn more about produce, plants, animals and insects. We also built an outdoor classroom to help us to learn outdoors in all weathers. Reception class did a wonderful job planting flowers with the CAG group in the local community while year 6 made an informative film about climate change in Cornwall. Our biggest achievement is reaching the Bronze Award as we work towards becoming a UNICEF Rights Respecting School!



2021 ended on a high when all classes created Christmas crafts using recycled materials which we sold at the CAG Christmas Fayre in November. Our stall alone raised £83 for the school!

Our community supported by donating and for a small entrance fee people could take as much as they needed. Everyone went home with a smile and bags full of amazing bargains. The day raised £213.90 for St Day Old Church.

December, and we faced the usual Christmas rush to buy everything new. Two Christmas events provided alternatives for our villages. "Made in St Day Christmas Fayre" supported 18 local makers to showcase their high quality Christmas gifts. The range of skills and creativity within our local villages is incredible and customers were delighted with the choice and quality of the presents on offer. Many of the traders reused materials (slate, textiles, thread, wool, picture frames) and no single use plastic was allowed in this fayre.

Another event was "Presents for our **family"**. Again local people had a sort out and donated things that they had never used. What an amazing response, boxes of good quality gifts were given to St Day & Carharrack School for children to choose a surprise gift for someone in their family.

What do we "take away" from these events?

- These events are fun
- Things are affordable for everyone
- Everyone wins
- We are not throwing stuff
- We are recycling locally
- We do not have to travel, except on foot
- We raise money for local school and groups
- We are doing the best for our planet and our children's future
- We are doing this together

The other was the "Childrens' Preloved Christmas Gifts". So many people sorted out their cupboards and donated good quality toys, books, games and so on. The Christmas Elves did well helping to fill St Day Community Centre with these treasures and Father Christmas told us that he was overjoyed to see these gifts going to new homes rather than being thrown away. It made his job a whole lot easier and he spent a much smaller amount of money! In addition a total of £450 was raised for St Day & Carharrack School.
